Dear Members and Friends of the portASAP COST Action,

Today, I would like to use this space to reflect on the success and failures of the past year. We are now in the second year of this Action and the main MC meeting will be in a month.

The challenge of this Action is to promote low-cost instrumentation alongside commercial instruments for chemical analysis. In this respect, we have witnessed some good outcomes. In the workshop in Brno, we discussed portable and open-source capillary electrophoresis (OPCE) instruments. You can find some of the presentations on our new website (portasap.eu). The work was well received within and outside the Action, and we have been invited to organise a plenary session in the upcoming [ITP2019](#) conference on this subject. This year has been good in disseminating of open source hardware (OSHW) in chemical analysis as we also have been invited to participate in the [RAFA2019](#) (recent advances in food analysis). Support for those two conferences is being discussed in the

CORE group and will be agreed during the MC meeting, but our participation will clearly facilitate dissemination of OSHW as chemical analysis tools. I would like to take the opportunity to thank all of you that promoted this year the PortASAP Cost Action in conferences, seminars or informally.

Short-term scientific missions (STSMs) are very important instruments within COST Actions. They allow to share expertise and know-how between research groups and facilitate the establishment of long-lasting collaborations. Five STSMs were completed in 2018; you can see their output in the website, five more are scheduled within this grant period. However, the number of STSMs is still below what was agreed in the Porto MC meeting and some of the allocated funds have not been used. The COST Action will only succeed with your commitment and we should aim to improve participation in STSMs. I will be happy to discuss strategies in the next MC meeting.

1ST PORTASAP HACKATHON



As you may be aware, the COST association granted us an additional budget for this Grant Period. This budget will be used to organise our first hackathon on OSHW. The event will take place in Aveiro (Portugal), on the 11/03/2019 and 12/03/2019. The aim will be to develop spectrometers (smartphone, raspberry PI/CCD, for example) to analyse wine. At this point we don't aim for performance, but we would like to have a simple design that will allow gathering data for chemometrics analysis. I will send additional information later, but I am happy to share some preliminary ideas with anyone interested.

STSMS - OPENING OF THE LAST CALL OF THE 2ND GRANT PERIOD

To try to use the remaining STSMS budget, an extra STSM call is now open. The call will run continuously until the end of the Grant Period, but for administrative reasons, STSMS will have to take place between the 10th of February and the 20th of March. I would also like to remind you of our STSM rules (<http://portasap.eu/stsm-rules.html>), in particular, 1. you should indicate the working group leader that will assess your application, 2. the budget needs to be justified and 3. after the STSM you will need to send a summary for publication of your work to the dissemination officer. All other rules apply.

CORE GROUP VACANCIES

WG1: Validation and dissemination of open-source hardware. Dr Krisjanis Smits will step down as working group leader after the MC meeting for personal reasons.

ITC Grants Coordinator. This is a new position open by the COST Association. [ITC grants](#) are grants targeting early career researchers from inclusiveness target countries to help them attending international conferences. The Conference Grants Coordinator performs the evaluation of each Conference Grant application. The tasks include: evaluate applications, approve or reject these applications in e-cost, evaluate the scientific report after the mission, post-approve or reject the report.

We are looking for motivated MC members or substitutes to fill those two positions. Elected members will join the core group and have a better opportunity to shape the Actions. If you are interested, please send a small motivation letter to the Vice-chair. The letter should include your previous involvement in this Action or other COST Action. Candidates will be presented and elected in the next Varazdin MC meeting.

PREPARATION OF THE 3RD GRANT PERIOD

The Varazdin MC meeting will be the occasion to pre-agree the activities for the next Grant Period. We have already received very interesting proposals, but if you would like to discuss some events, you should contact your Working Group Leader.
